**MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON SATURDAY, 19 FEB 2011 AT FX PLAZA  
SENAYAN , JAKARTA, INDONESIA.**

**1. Introduction**

The meeting commenced at 11am local time. Mr Maman Hermansyah welcomed and thanked all members for their presence. Members were informed that the key issue of the meeting was to discuss on the 2011 SEA Games and its supported activities like SEACF Circuit and Courses.

**2. Confirmation of Minutes**

Minutes of the last meeting held on 26 Feb 2010 in Bali were confirmed with no amendment.

### **3. Progress Report from the ACC Sports Department Meeting held in Guangzhou, China**

Mr Rasip shared the key outcome of the meeting which was held on 26 January in Guangzhou, China.

#### **3.1 Technical Courses:**

The ACC agreed to conduct the following courses, scheduled for May 2011 in Putrajaya, Kuala Lumpur:

a. Route Setter Course

Maximum of 15 participants from all ACC members will be accepted for the course. Mr Kim Dong Hyun from Korea will be the course Instructor. Course fee is expected at \$400 Singapore Dollar per person. All successful participants will be awarded with the Regional Certification allowing them to set routes for ACC recognized events.

b. Judges Course

Maximum of 20 participants from all ACC members will be accepted for the course. Mr Francis Lee from Hongkong will be the course Instructor. Course fee is expected at \$400 Singapore Dollar per person. All successful participants will be awarded with the Regional Certifications allowing them to judge for ACC recognizes events.

Mr Zade from Malaysia will be approaching the Putrajaya Climbing Centre operator to discuss on the schedule dates. PMM will also be hosting the SEACF Circuit to coincide with the course for purpose of practical sessions.

#### **3.2 ACC Activities in 2011**

##### **[1] 2011 ASIA CHAMPIONSHIP**

Date: 11-13 December 2011

Country: Hong Kong

Disciplines:

- Lead
- Boulder
- Speed
- Team speed (Men), (Women) and (Mix)

Note: The ACC General Assembly will also be held during the period. Election will be held for ACC new EXCO.

## **[2] 2011 ASIA YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIP**

Date: 28-30 July 2011

Country: Singapore

Disciplines:

- Lead
- Speed
- Team speed (Boys), (Girls) and (Mix). Only one age group / category.

Category:

- Junior
- Youth A
- Youth B
- Youth C (Lead) climb same route as Youth B.....
- Youth C (top rope)

Note: Will also include the SEACF Circuit

### **4. SEACF Circuit**

4.1 The meeting agreed that to allow for more climbers interaction and skills enhancement, the SEACF Circuit will be reintroduced. The Circuit will also allow climbers within the Asean Region to prepare for the coming SEA Games.

4.2 The meeting agreed to organise the following Circuits:

#### **[1] SEACF CIRCUIT (1)**

Date: Early/Mid May 2011

Country: Bangkok, Thailand

Disciplines: Lead, Speed and Boulder

#### **[2] SEACF CIRCUIT (2)**

Date: late May to coincide with the technical courses

Country: Putrajaya, Malaysia

Disciplines: Lead, Speed and Boulder

#### **[3] SEACF CIRCUIT (3)**

Date: Mid June

Country: Jakarta, Indonesia

Disciplines: Lead, Speed Track and Boulder

#### [4] SEAFCF CIRCUIT (4)

Date: 23 to 24 July to coincide with the AYC

Country: Singapore

Disciplines: Lead, Speed and Boulder

#### 5. SEA Games

- a. The Indonesia NOC had included Climbing as one of the medal sport in 2011 SEA Games in Indonesia. Sport Climbing will be organised from 12 to 16 November in Palembang,
- b. The SEA Games Council will be having their meeting on 25 feb in Bali to finalise the list of medal games.
- c. A total of 10 categories had been confirmed as follows:
  - a. Lead (Men & Women);
  - b. Boulder (Men & Women);
  - c. Boulder Team (Men & Women);
  - d. Speed Track (Men & Women)
  - e. Speed Track Relay (Men & Women)

Each country will be allowed to send 2 climbers for the individual events and 4 for the team events.

The Technical handbook will be circulated to all federations to facilitate their preparation for the game.

The meeting was confident of members support and look forward to the participation from 6 to 7 countries including Timor Leste. It was also hopeful that Myanmar being the 2013 host could send a team to participate in the event.

Mr Rasip conveyed ACC financial offer to promote the sport to both Myanmar and Timor Leste. The meeting agreed to send Mr Maman and Mr Chaiyudh (Woody) to commence the initial approach for the purpose.

SEACF would work closely with FPTI to ensure the professional organisation of the event. This includes competition management, technical competence and others.


A meeting among SEACF members will be held in July in Singapore to discuss the final details.
